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§8(c) Disfigurement

Serious & permanent disfigurement to the following body parts:

Hand, Head, Face, Neck, Arm

Leg below the knee, Chest above the axillary line

Maximum Weeks: 162 (on or after 2/1/2006)

Maximum Weeks: 150 (up to 1/31/2006)

Provided:

1. Arbitration hearing is not less than 6 months after the accident date.
2. No compensation is payable under this paragraph where compensation is payable under paragraphs (d), (e) or (f) of this Section.
3. A duly appointed member of a fire department in a city with population greater than 500,000 can recover for disfigurement only if caused by burns.

Occupational Disease Act Statutory Loss Schedule: Disability in Weekly Equivalents

{Owens Corning Fiberglass v. IIC, QDEX 1990-2-03, 198 Ill.App.3d 605} Section 10 of the O.D. Act and Section 10 of the W.C. Act are comparable and provide methods by which to calculate an employee's average weekly wage (AWW)/ After the AWW is calculated, however, each Section 10 refers back, either directly or indirectly, to Sections 7 and 8 of the W.C. Act in order to determine the rate of compensation that should be paid.

- For accidents July 19, 2005 and earlier, the schedules in Report A apply.
- For accidents July 20, 2005 to November 15, 2005, the 2005 Amendment schedules & later apply, this Report B.
- For accidents November 16, 2005 to January 31, 2006 the schedules in Report A apply.
- From February 1, 2006 to current, the 2005 Amendment schedules & later apply, this Report B.
